Summer Fair Donations


We hope to receive lots of cake donations from this afternoon, 3pm onwards or on Saturday morning. Helpers will be at school from 9am.






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Author Workshop

Bible Exhibition



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

On Wednesday, Year One were lucky enough to visit the Transport museum in Birkenhead, where they found out lots of





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
