Communication

Regular communication between home and school is one of the most positive ways in which children can be supported through their school years, and we seek to encourage this dialogue wherever possible. We very much value your support and interest in your child's education.

Staff, including senior leadership, are present on the school gate each morning to greet families and to answer any questions. Parents and carers will continue to receive letters and email messages to keep you informed at the most appropriate time. For urgent messages we will use our text messaging service. We also have our school [website](#), [Twitter](#) feed and online [calendar](#) showing the latest information about school activities and events.

All parents and carers are welcome to attend school social and community events and invitations to these events will come via newsletter, email, social media messages or

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correspondence from Friends of Dawpool School (FoDS).

schooloffice@dawpool.wirral.sch.uk. Staff will do their best to make contact with you as soon as possible within their working hours.

Due to the high volume of emails received in school each day, it is not always possible to respond quickly. We will strive to respond to email as soon as possible. However, if you require a timely response, please telephone the school and speak with staff directly.

All pupil absences / appointments should be directed to the school office on 0151 648 3412 (option 1).

Parents' evenings will take place after half term and we will confirm the dates with parents shortly.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance

It is crucial that we monitor children's attendance closely, as those who attend school above 95% have the highest chance of success. In cases

where a pupil's attendance drops below 90%, the Department for Education identifies them as a 'Persistent Absentee,' a designation that can significantly impact their learning and progress. This week, we have written to parents of pupils who fall under this category.

We understand that sickness can happen, but it is still vital that all pupils have access to the high-quality education we provide. We ask for your support in ensuring your child's regular attendance at school.

Mild illness and school attendance

It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above. Children with diarrhoea or vomiting should stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours). We ask parents to read [NHS 'Is my child too ill for school?' guidance](#) for more information.

Anxiety and school attendance

In addition to respiratory illnesses, children may be absent from school due to symptoms of anxiety. Worry and mild or moderate anxiety, whilst sometimes difficult emotions, can be a

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normal part of growing up for many children and young people. Being in school can often help alleviate the underlying issues. A prolonged period of absence is likely to heighten a child's anxiety about attending in the future, rather than reduce it. If your child is experiencing persistent symptoms of anxiety, please inform school at the earliest opportunity so that we can provide support.

Family holidays and school attendance

To support excellent attendance of pupils, all of the Term Dates until **Summer 2025** can be found on the [council website](#) and on the [School Calendar](#).

Please note that family holidays will not be authorised in term time. This includes leaving school early on a Friday to facilitate weekend breaks. Unauthorised holidays will be reported to the local authority and a fixed penalty notice may be issued. All non-emergency appointments, including routine dental appointments, should be made out of school hours.

Foundation 1 Classroom

Next week, we will begin the process of replacing the roof on the Foundation 1 classroom. If weather permits, the project should take approximately 2 weeks to complete. We have made arrangements to ensure that the school

day will continue uninterrupted, but a portion of the school car park will be designated for storage during this time. Our Foundation 1 pupils are currently happy and settled in their temporary classroom in the main school building. We are looking forward to completing the roof work and creating a smooth transition back to their original classroom in due course.



It's the time of year when we may experience adverse weather conditions.

In the event of severe snow or ice first thing in the morning, please check to see if the school is open before travelling:

- A message will be posted on the homepage of the school's website from 7:30am.
- A message will be posted on the school's twitter feed from 7:30am.

If extreme weather develops during the school day, we will aim to remain open until the end of the normal school day. However, this may not always be possible. Parents should check to see if the school will remain open:

- A message will be posted on the homepage of the school's website.

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- A message will be posted on the school's twitter feed.
- An email will be sent to the primary contact.
