School Lane Parking

Attached with this week's Dawpool News is the school's protocol for safe parking on School Lane. We know that School Lane can be very busy at peak times and our single best piece of advice is to park away from School Lane and



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walk whenever possible. If you are parking on School Lane, please be courteous to our neighbours by adhering to the following:

- Please do not move any traffic cones that have been placed on the road by either our neighbours or local businesses.
- Please do not park in front of our neighbours drives or across any white lines.
- Please do not park on the single yellow lines at the top of School Lane unless you have a blue badge.

Additionally, the staff car park is **only** for staff and when you are dropping off or collecting children from school, including wraparound care, we ask you not to use our car park.

Changes in Weather

The weather is gradually getting colder. To ensure there is good ventilation throughout the school, we may need to open the windows during the day so please ensure your child has a school jumper. Your child may also wish to wear an additional underlayer on colder days.

We are committed to ensuring that your child has 30-minutes of physical activity each day. Please provide your child with a light-weight cagoule to ensure that outdoor activities can continue during rainy weather. Thank you.

Flu Immunisation

We have received notification that the flu nasal spray will be administered to pupils in F2-Y6 on **Thursday 18th November.** The flu immunisation is only administered with parental consent and information about how to do this will be sent home shortly.

Email Communication

Due to the high volume of emails received in school each day, it is not always possible to respond quickly. As a school our first priority is to deliver high quality teaching and learning which is more difficult if staff are constantly monitoring and responding to email.

The class webpages are now ready for the new academic year. Each page provides parents and carers with an overview of the children's learning on a week-to-week basis. Your child's class




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webpage includes:



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
