Little People, BIG DREAMS

Be Bold, Be Brave, DREAM BIG!

As all of the pupils return to face-to-face education after the lockdown, there is a danger that schools begin to fixate on a deficit model of learning and narrow the curriculum for pupils. At Dawpool, we want to look towards a positive future for all children and help them move towards their dreams and aspirations with determination and confidence.

This half term, we are focusing on a wholeschool project entitled 'Little People - Big Dreams' and we have written to parents today with more information. During the project, we will be exploring the theme of equality and diversity in the world. During the next two weeks, class teachers will be dedicating some of their curriculum time to explore the lives of significant people. Each class will be using books from a collection called 'Little People - Big Dreams'. These books teach the children about the lives of significant people (past and present) from designers and artists to scientists and activists. All of them achieved incredible things, often through great adversity, by making discoveries, breaking boundaries, highlighting injustice and



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paving the way for the way we live our lives today.

Little People Big Dreams Dress Up Day!

In celebration of our learning, we invite pupils to dress up (optional) on the theme of 'Little People Big Dreams' on **Friday 30**th **April**. Pupils are encouraged to dress as a significant person who has overcome adversity and made a difference to the world we live in today (past or present). During the Summer term, we will be focusing on reading across the curriculum. We will be listening to your child read on a 1:1 basis using a benchmarking tool to accurately identify the best reading level and book band for your child based on both their fluency and comprehension. Your child will then be provided with a reading book from the new whole-school reading scheme which has been kindly purchased by FoDS.



To support our focus on reading and aspirations, a virtual book fair will also be taking place during the next two weeks. We have partnered with our local Usborne representative Liz Neale to set up this fundraising opportunity for school. Liz will be promoting books on the following themes: equality and diversity, curriculum books to support your child's learning and reading for pleasure books. A Facebook page has been set up and regular updates and offers will be posted throughout the two-week period.
