Payments to School

Please could all payments due to school be made by the Wednesday of next week as we need everything up to date before our financial year end. Please inform us immediately if you have difficulty making payments. All matters are treated in confidence. Thank you for your support with this very important issue

COVID Update

A reminder that a child must not attend school if they have one or more of these symptoms: **cough**, **high temperature** or **loss of taste and smell**. If your child has any of these symptoms, they should stay at home. Siblings should also stay at home, even if they don't have symptoms themselves.

A symptomatic child should have a Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test at a symptomatic test centre. If the test is negative, your child, and their sibling(s), can return to school if fit to do so. Lateral Flow Device (LFD) tests should not be used with primary-aged pupils. Please note that any absences from school must be reported to the school office as soon as possible.

Year 5 Parents

Please note that registration for pupils to sit the <u>St Anselm's Entrance Test</u> and <u>Upton Hall</u> <u>Entrance Test</u> in Autumn 2021 (for September 2022 entry) are now open.

The registration to sit the 11+ test in Autumn 2021 is not yet open. We will advise you as soon as the information is available.

Healthy Snacks

We remind parents/carers that children should avoid bringing sweets, cakes or sugary snacks into school. Playtime snacks should be healthy options only. We have a <u>lunchbox policy</u> on our website that we would ask parents to be aware of. Thank you for your help.
