Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have all had a good week. As always, it has been a pleasure to spend time around school and see the children so engaged in their learning and school life. I have enjoyed being in classrooms this week observing English lessons and seeing the development of our new English scheme. The children have been highly motivated by the new texts and seeing their enthusiasm has been wonderful.

I would like to begin by thanking the parents and carers who have expressed an interest in joining our Parent Forum for school dinners. We are very grateful for your willingness to share your views and work in partnership with us as we continue to develop our provision. Your feedback is invaluable, and we look forward to working closely with representatives as plans move forward.

As part of our ongoing commitment to ensuring the very best for our children, we are also reviewing our behaviour policy. In order to gather parent and carer views, I would strongly encourage you to complete the short online survey that has recently been shared. Your thoughts and perspectives are extremely important to us and will help to inform future

developments in this area.

I would also like to take this opportunity to remind parents and carers of the importance of children wearing the correct school uniform each day. A consistent approach to uniform helps to promote a sense of belonging, pride in our school and readiness for learning. Over the coming weeks, staff will be reminding children of our uniform expectations and supporting them to meet these consistently. We are very grateful for your continued support in ensuring children arrive at school dressed appropriately and ready to learn.

Keeping our children safe, both in and out of school, remains a key priority. With this in mind, I would like to draw your attention to some important information regarding online safety, particularly in relation to Roblox. Roblox is used by many children from a very young age, with a particularly large number of players aged between 8 and 12. There is no fixed minimum age to play, and children can find themselves sharing games and social spaces with much older users. Combined with user-generated content and social features such as chat and voice chat, children's experiences can vary widely.

What helps most in practice includes having regular, open conversations with children about

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what they enjoy playing, who they play with and what they notice online. It is helpful when adults show curiosity by watching or even playing alongside children, so that online gaming is not seen as a secret or separate world. Children also benefit from a clear understanding of personal information, knowing why chats should stay focused on the game and when it is important to tell an adult. Reassuring children that any worries should always be shared – whether that be upsetting content, unkind behaviour or inappropriate language – is vital. Supporting children to confidently use block and report tools, alongside making active use of safety settings such as age-appropriate controls, chat restrictions and parent account oversight, can all help to create a safer online experience.

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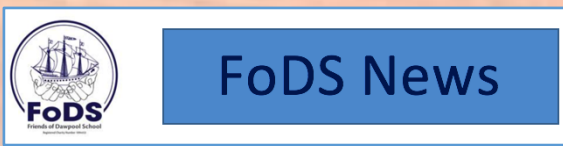
