Absence messages

In particular at present when we have to record any possible covid related illnesses differently than say a tummy bug or cold. If as a result of your child's symptoms you intend to get a PCR test, please advise us and also once the result is available update us with that information. The absence line can be used for this too. Many thanks for your support with this government requirement regarding the recording of illnesses within schools.



Tuesday: A focus on fundamental British Values

This week we focused on another big question, based on a current news story, which relates to one of the fundamental British Values: Democracy, Rule of Law, Individual Liberty, Mutual Respect, Tolerance of Different Faiths and Beliefs (see the British Values page of our website for more information)

This Week's Focus Question: What would encourage you to use public transport?



News Story: Encouraging people to use buses more often is to be a central part of the Government's plan to reach net zero by 2050. Bus stops will be heated and have changing rooms and Wi-Fi in a bid to create eco-friendly park and rides for cyclists. They will also act as a focal point for cyclists, electric car drivers and rail commuters to switch easily between different modes of transport, with bosses calling the new stops mobility hubs.



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British Value: Democracy - People aged 18 or over vote for who they want to govern our country. Our Government makes decisions for the country. Mobility hubs form part of the Government's plan to reach net zero by 2050.
