

Dear Parents and Carers,

I would like to wish all of our families a warm welcome to this new academic year. Also, a special welcome to families who are joining us at Dawpool for the first time. Following the challenges of the last few years, it is wonderful to start this year with a true sense of community and commitment to the education, nurturing and development of all children in our care. Together, we can be in school to enable Christian values to flourish and to continue to enhance our standards and achievements.

Dawpool School Governing Body is made up of volunteers who include 6 foundation governors (appointed by the Diocesan Board of Education, in conjunction with our Rector and our Parochial Church Council), 2 elected parents, 1 elected staff member and a local authority representative.
