Ordinal Numbers. We will go outside to have a go at doing our own Great race. Split into groups and undertake different races to determine who finishes 1st, 2nd 3rd, etc. We will hand out lollysticks with the ordinal numbers written on them. After the race can they put themselves in the correct order? Repeat with children and different race styles.</p>	<p>We recommend the following resources and activities to achieve this objective: Lunar New Year is a festival celebrated by lots of different cultures across Asia. In China they call it Chinese New Year. Watch CBeebies 'Let's Celebrate', 'Peppa Pig's Chinese New Year' or 'My First Festivals' and find out more about how people celebrate this festival. Create a list of ways they celebrate on the board. Can we re-cap and compare these to how people celebrated Diwali and Christmas. A lot of the ways overlap Clean house, special clothes, special, food, decorations, fireworks and music.</p>
