WORSHIP

Dawpool's daily act of collective worship is viewed as an integral and important part of school life. Through this and in the general ethos of the school we seek to promote our vision:

The worship of the school is based on promoting the **Person**, **Love and Work of Jesus** which permeates the ethos of the school. Worship is when we meet to acknowledge and reflect in God's word and the teachings of Jesus.

Work of Jesus (Our Learning Values) Jeremiah 29:11

This half term the children have explored the values of **generosity**, **faithfulness** and **patience**. The children have used the teachings of Jesus to reflect on these values:

Mark 12:41-44 Jesus tells the story of the Widow's Offering

John 13:1-17 Jesus washes the feet of his disciples Luke 22:7-13 Jesus shares The Last Supper

Matthew 26:56-78 The Trial of Jesus

Person of Jesus (Our Christian Values)

Galatians 5:22-23 'The Fruit of the Spirit is Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Generosity, Faithfulness, Gentleness and Self-Control.'

This half term the children have explored the Bible:

What is The Bible? A recap on the stories covered so far.

How can we use the Bible? The story of Moses and the Burning Bush.

Why is the Bible important to Christians? The story of the Nativity.

How can the Bible inspire us today? The story of the Good Samaritan.

What does the Bible say about Easter? The evidence for Jesus' death and resurrection.

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Love of Jesus (Our HeartSmart Actions) Matthew 22: 36:40 'Love the Lord God with all your heart with all your soul and with all your mind. Love your neighbour as yourself.'

This half term, the children have reflected on our **HeartSmart Actions** through the Relationships and Health Education Curriculum.

HeartSmart is a scheme of work that we use to build character, emotional health and resilience in children. It equips them with foundational principles, skills, habits and a mindset that will improve their mental health, relationships and academic achievement.

HeartSmart is delivered around 6 key topics:

- Get Heart Smart
- Don't forget to let love in
- Too much selfie isn't healthy
- Don't rub it in, rub it out
- Fake is a mistake
- No way through, isn't true
