English – Poetry (Two lessons)	2 nd - 3 rd
This week is all about poetry. I have chosen one of my favourite poetry authors because his poems are often funny and they are brilliant to perform. His name is Michael Rosen and he is a bit of a superstar in the world of teaching! You might know him best as the author of 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'.	July



The poems we are going to look at come from his book 'Jelly Boots Smelly Boots'. I think you're going to love them! Once you have discovered his YouTube channel, you may wish to continue exploring his poetry in your own time. There are just so many poems to enjoy!

Some of the objectives that can be met through these activities are:

- To know how to listen and respond to a wide range of poems from a single poet collection
- To understand that poems are written for different reasons
- To recognise how a poet uses poetry as a voice to express their own feelings and views
- To draft, compose and write poems based on real and personal experiences using language with intent for effect on the reader

Lesson 1

Discuss:

- 1. What is poetry? Discuss your child's preconceptions.
- 2. What do we like about poetry?
- 3. What don't we like about it?
- 4. What do we expect from it?
- 5. Have you read any poetry collections recently?
- 6. When do you expect to hear or read poetry?
- 7. Look around your home for books that contain poetry. (Julia Donaldson books are full of rhyme and serve as examples of poetry)

Introduce the author 'Michael Rosen' as the poet we are studying.

Listen to the following poems and discuss what you notice as you watch each one.

Tips: Think about how Michael performs poetry. What facial expressions or mannerisms does he use? How does his voice rise and fall to emphasise the words? Do you notice him pausing? Do you hear any rhyme? Is there any repetition?

Question: After hearing those poems, does your child want to alter their definition of what poetry is? What is their opinion of poetry?

Lesson 2:

Discuss:

- Did you like the poem? Why/why not?
- Did you notice any patterns in the poem?
- Was there anything in the poem that you didn't understand? Do you want to ask any questions?
- If you could ask one question about the poem what would it be?
- What could you picture when you heard the poem?
- Did you notice any rhymes in the poem? What effect did it have on you when you read it?

Perform: A family performance!

Choose one of the poems you have listened to (or another from his website). Print out the words (a quick google search should locate them). Divide up the poem into parts and allocate them to each member of the family.

Tips:

- Look at your chosen poem being performed by Michael. Can you imitate his style?
 Work together as a family to listen, support and encourage each other to perform your sections.
- Can you incorporate some actions?
- Record yourselves and watch it back. What worked well? What would you include next time?
- Laughter and mistakes are all part of the enjoyment of performing.
