# COVID-19

A revised COVID-19 risk assessment and contingency plan for the New Year can be found on the <u>school website</u>. These documents include all of the recent

changes to guidance.

#### A few reminders:

- Please inform school immediately if your child tests positive for COVID-19
- Adults who are fully vaccinated and all children and young people aged between 5 and 18 years and 6 months identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 are strongly advised to take a LFD test every day for 7 days and continue to attend their setting as normal, unless they have a positive test result.
- Children under 5 years who are identified as close contacts are exempt from self- isolation and do not need to take part in daily testing of close contacts.
- Children under 5 are advised to take a PCR test if the positive case is in their household
- From 11<sup>th</sup> January in England, asymptomtic people who receive a positive LFD test result for COVID-



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19 will not be required to take a confirmatory PCR test and must self-isolate immediately.

 Individuals may now take LFD tests on day 6 and day 7 of their selfisolation period. Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of self-isolation.

#### Remote Learning Procedure.

The Department for Education (DfE) are clear that pupils should not be expected to work at home if they are unwell. If your child is poorly, they should rest until they are fit enough to return to school.

If your child tests positive for COVID-19, please inform school immediately. If you determine that your child is well enough to complete school work, please refer to the school's Remote Learning Procedure which provides clarity and transparency to parents and carers about what to expect from remote education.

Lessons are available for your child to complete on the class pages of the school website.

If your child has been well enough to complete work at home, they should be well enough to return to school as soon as the self-isolation period ends. Individuals may now take LFD tests on day 6 and day 7 of their self-isolation period. Those who receive two negative test results are no longer required to complete 10 full days of self-isolation.

When your child returns to school, please return any work that has been completed offline so that the class teacher can evaluate your child's progress, address any misconceptions and help them to catch-up on any work they have missed.
