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## WORSHIP

Dawpool's daily act of collective worship is viewed as an integral and important part of school life. Through this and in the general ethos of the school we seek to promote our vision:

'The Dawpool community are united in their ambition to create a school which embodies the person, love and work of Jesus Christ: a school which enables Christian values to flourish and where all children may experience the abundant life that Jesus offers.'

Worship is a time where we come together to share our love of God and celebrate our achievements together. The worship of the school is based on promoting the **Person, Love and Work of Jesus** which permeates the ethos of the school. Worship is when we meet to acknowledge and reflect in God's word and the teachings of Jesus.

### Work of Jesus (Our Learning Values) Jeremiah 29:11

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord. "Plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

This half term the children have explored the learning values of **Noticing**, **Imagining**,

Capitalising and Reasoning. We have also explored the values of Kindness and Gentleness. The children have used the teachings of Jesus to reflect on these values:

> Luke 19:1-10 Jesus notices Zacchaeus.

Luke 10:25-37 Jesus tells the parable of the Good Samaritan.

> Matthew 14:13-21 Jesus feeds 5000 people.

John 2:1-11 Jesus turns water into wine.

Luke 15: 11-32 Jesus tells the parable of the prodigal son.

### Person of Jesus (Our Christian Values)

**Galatians 5:22-23** 'The Fruit of the Spirit is Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Generosity, Faithfulness, Gentleness and Self-Control.'

This half term the children have explored the value of **aspirations**:

- What are aspirations? The Story of Moses and his mother.
- How can having aspirations help us?

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The Story of Abraham & Sarah

• Reaching for the stars The Story of David & Goliath

We have also shared in Advent and Christmas through scripture and stories:

- The wait The prophecies foretold about the birth of Jesus.
- Time to prepare Jesus tells the parable of the 10 bridesmaids.
- The journey
  The journey of Mary & Joseph to
  Bethlehem.
- **Party time!** The birth of Jesus and the special people who visited him.

It has also been wonderful to share in a wide variety of Christmas nativities and church services this term.

Love of Jesus (Our HeartSmart Actions) Matthew 22: 36:40 'Love the Lord God with all your heart with all your soul and with all your mind. Love your neighbour as yourself.' This half term, the children have reflected on our **HeartSmart Actions** through the Relationships and Health Education Curriculum.

HeartSmart is a scheme of work that we use to build character, emotional health and resilience in children. It equips them with foundational principles, skills, habits and a mindset that will improve their mental health, relationships and academic achievement.

HeartSmart is delivered around 6 key topics:

- Get Heart Smart
- Don't forget to let love in
- Too much selfie isn't healthy
- Don't rub it in, rub it out
- Fake is a mistake
- No way through, isn't true

## **BRITISH VALUES**

In Worship each week, Dawpool pupils focus on a **big question**, based on a current news story, which relates to one of the fundamental British Values: **Democracy**, **Rule of Law**, **Individual Liberty**, **Mutual Respect**, **Tolerance of Different Faiths and Beliefs**.

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This half term, pupils have focused on the following questions:
