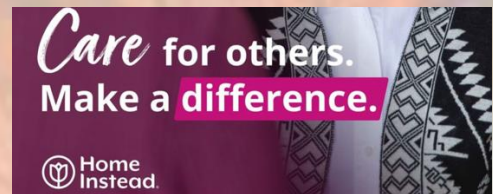


Hockey Heroes

We appreciate children have recently designed a card for FoDS, but we thought this was an opportunity that some children might like to participate in with the chance to win a prize.



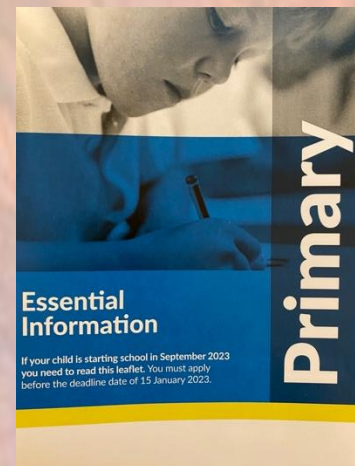
Sporting Success

- Fake is a mistake
