# **INDUSTRIAL ACTION**

### **Teachers' Industrial Action**

You will be aware that the **National Education Union (NEU)** has announced national and regional strike action in England. The next date is:

Please note that Dawpool **is open as usual on this date** for all children including wrap-around care.

There are 2 further proposed dates for industrial action on **15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> March**. Again, we expect to be open as usual on both of these dates, but will let you know at the earliest

opportunity if the situation changes.

Whilst Dawpool will remain open to all pupils, we continue to support the education sector in securing better pay, funding and conditions for our schools.

This half term the children have explored the values of **Absorption**, **Perseverance**, **Empathy**, **Listening**, **Managing Distractions and Self Control**. The children have used the teachings of Jesus to reflect on these values:

Luke 2:41-52 The boy Jesus at the temple.

Matthew 3:13-17 The baptism of Jesus

Luke 18:1-8 Jesus tells the parable of the persistent widow.

Luke 13:10-17 Jesus heals a crippled woman.

Luke:10-38-42 Jesus visits Mary and Martha. Luke 8: 4-15 Jesus tells the parable of the farmer and the seeds. Matthew 4:1-11 Jesus is tested in the wilderness.

### Love of Jesus (Our HeartSmart Actions) Matthew 22: 36:40

- Too much selfie isn't healthy
- Don't rub it in, rub it out
- Fake is a mistake
- No way through, isn't true
