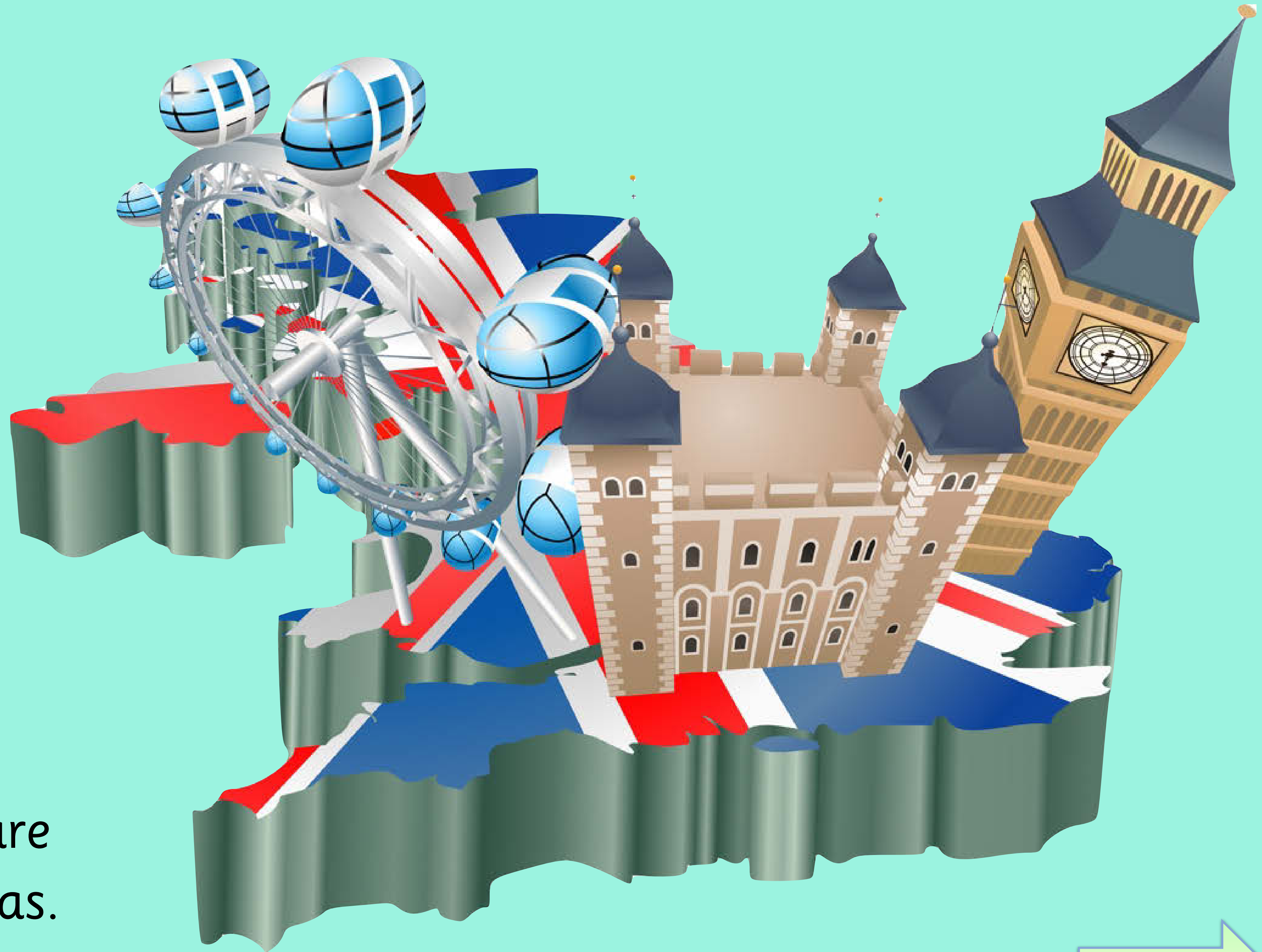

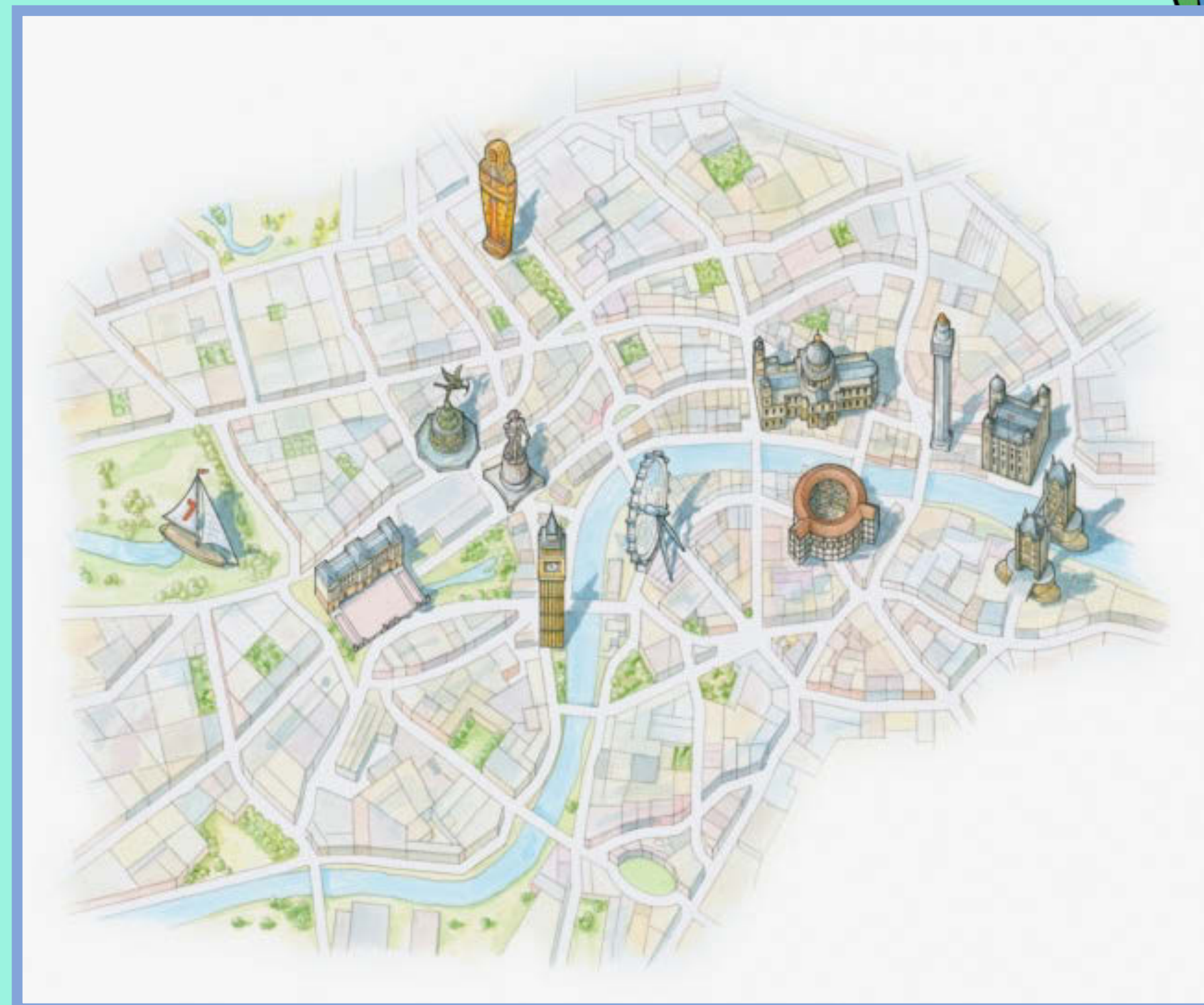
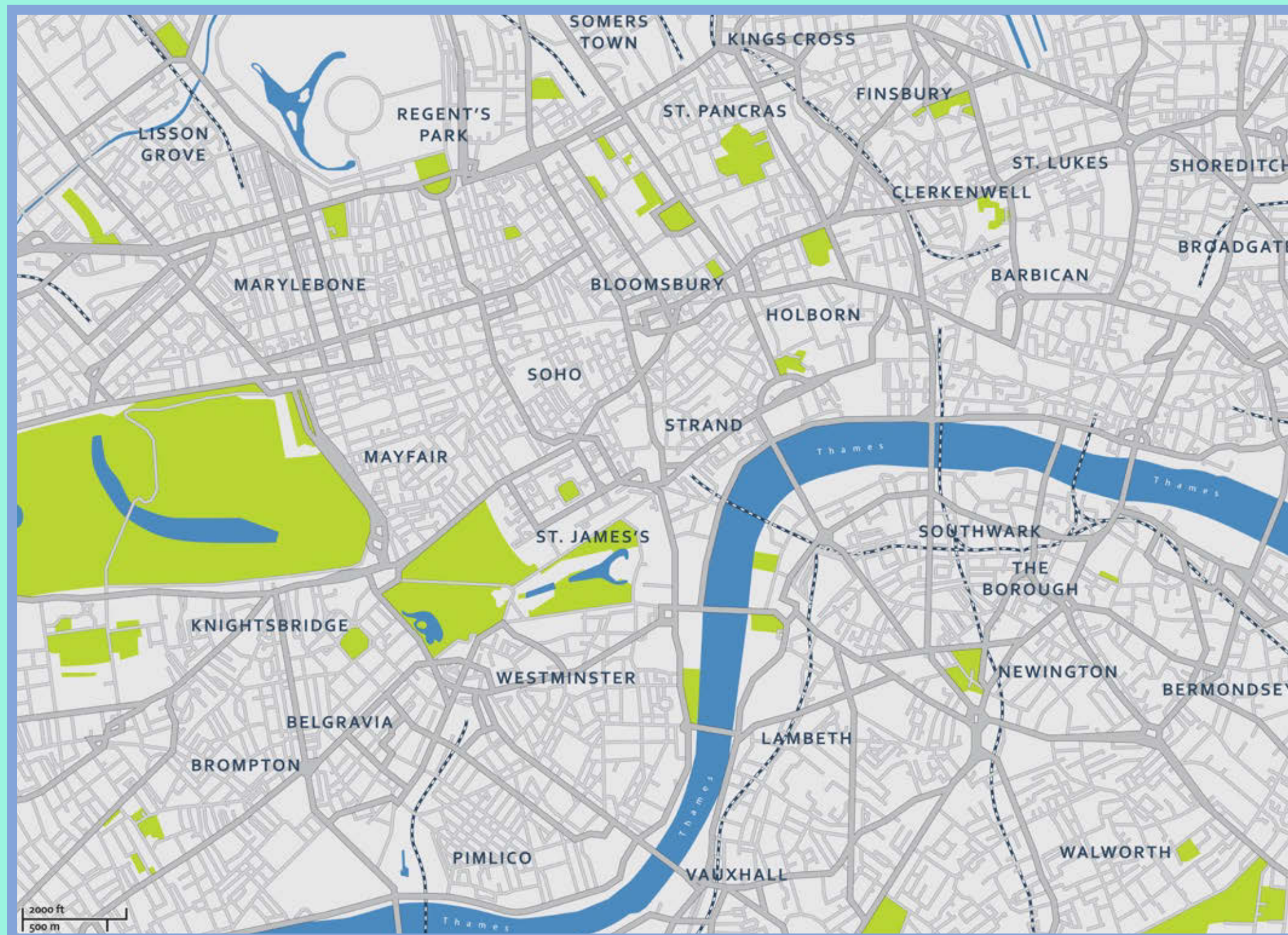


The photograph shows what some of London looks like from above and the map on the right shows where London is in the UK. Do you think you would be able to find your way around London using this photo or this map?

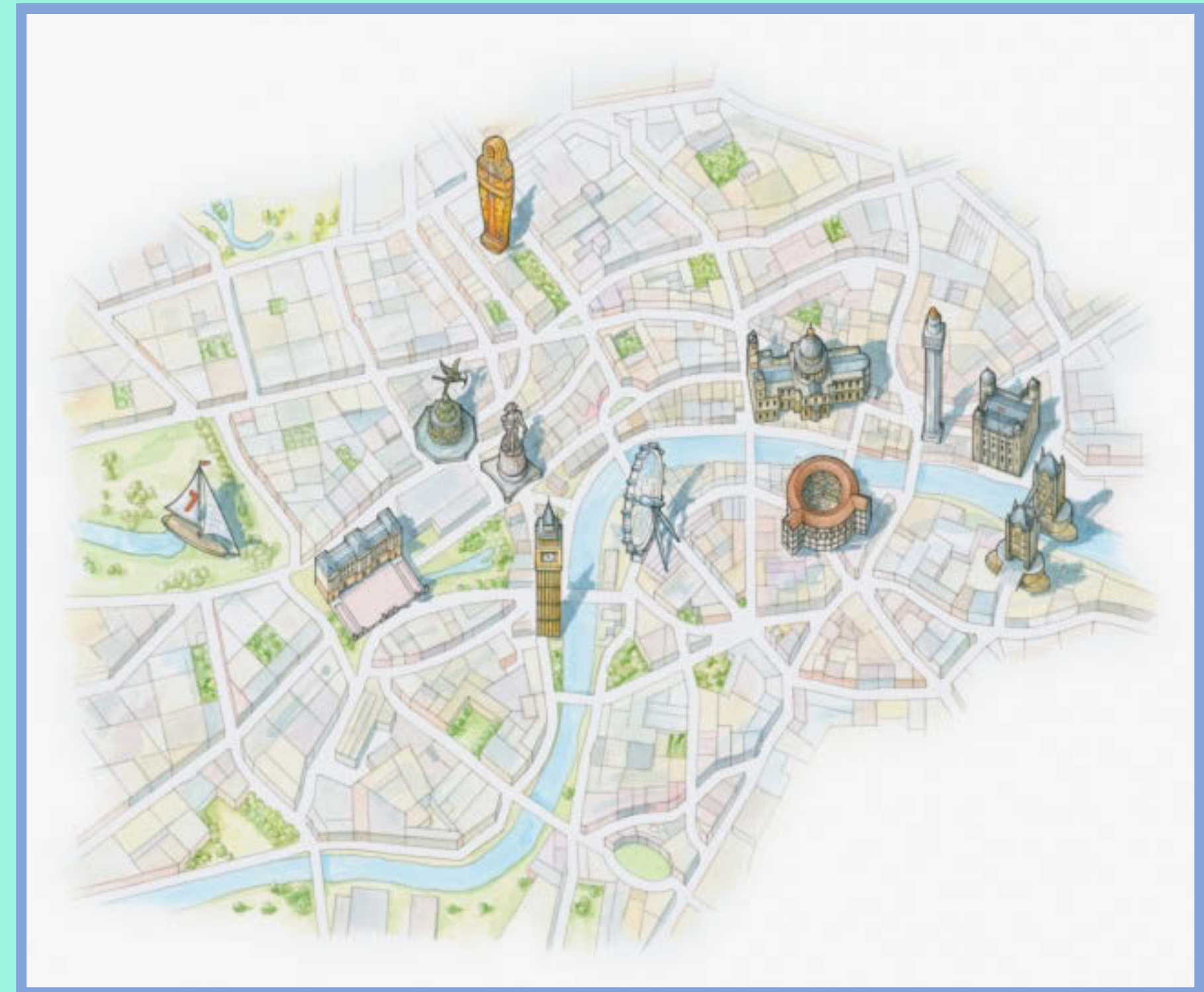
I think I would find it easier to find my way around London using a street map than a photograph!

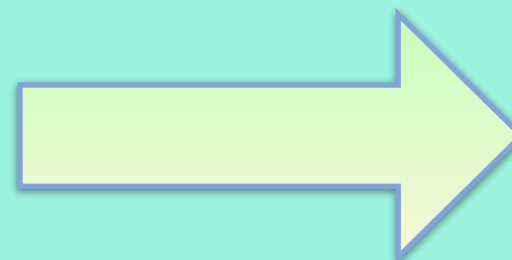
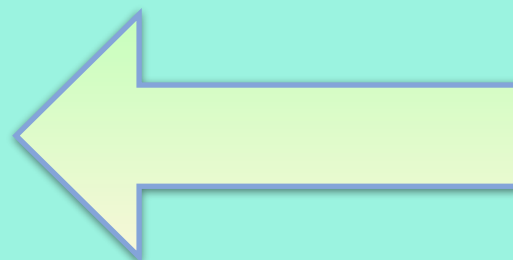




Oh dear, I forgot to show you the key for the map! Before you can work out how Jan gets to school you need to find her house and the school on the map.
