



How would you record London?









The photograph shows what some of London looks like from above and the map on the right shows where London is in the UK. Do you think you would be able to find your way around London using this photo or this map?

I think I would find it easier to find my way around London using a street map than a photograph!








How are these maps different?










There are a few different routes Jan could travel to school. Can you follow this route on the map?








She took this route!
