Ukraine Donations

Rosie Parsons mum of Alba in Y2 has kindly offered to coordinate the collection of any donations to help people in Ukraine. The following items are particularly requested:

Batteries, torches, warm clothes and shoes that are new or in very good condition, hats and gloves, antiseptics, nappies, wound dressings, sanitary products, sleeping bags and bedding. As well as items for children; colouring pencils and books, school supplies, teddies and toys, children's clothes. Again, all to be new or in very good condition.

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We ask for donations to be dropped at the school office and they will be collected regularly and delivered to a local drop off point. We will initially collect these items until **Friday 25th March** and then review the situation.

COVID-19 Update

On 21 February the Prime Minister set out the next phase of the Government's COVID19 response <u>"Living with Covid"</u>. COVID-19 continues to be a virus that we learn to live with, however the imperative to reduce the disruption to children's education remains.

All COVID restrictions have now been lifted, but COVID is still very prevalent in our school community. We have an increasing number of pupils who have tested positive for COVID and are absent from school. We are therefore advised by our local public health officials to reinstate some control measures.

A few points to note:

If you have any of the main symptoms of COVID-19 or a

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positive test result, the public health advice is to <u>stay at home, and</u> <u>avoid contact with other people</u>.

 Children with COVID-19 should not attend their school while they are infectious. They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. If both these test results are negative, they can return to school, as long as they feel well enough to do so and do not have a temperature.
